

Mp3 Streamliner Instructions.

You must have ffmpeg and ffprobe installed on your desktop for this program to operate.

Here is the link of how to Install ffmpeg (which also includes and installs ffprobe): <https://phoenixnap.com/kb/ffmpeg-windows>).

Mp3 Streamliner.exe is not a self-installer, but a standalone program you place on your desktop or into another directory. You could put it in a directory, say "Audio Tools", etc.

After installing ffmpeg, run Mp3 Streamliner.mp3. This version checks to see if ffmpeg is installed. I do this by running a background command that displays ffmpeg's help file to a file. If the file generated is less than 200 bytes (being safe, since it is over 4000 bytes) that's an indication that ffmpeg is not installed. Nevertheless it continues the program with a warning in a message window.

Drag and drop the mp3s you wish to convert to any or all of 64KB, 48KB or 32KB.

All originals are left untouched. Directories for each bitrate are first created and all qualifying mp3s are converted into them.

Existing files having the same bitrate are COPIED into them as well to make it easier to get a set all at the same bitrate. This reduces headaches. Original mp3s with bitrates lower than the lowest selected rate are left untouched.

You may also append to the filename the bitrate which also shows that it was converted. i.e. "Converted File 48 KB.mp3".

The status is displayed during processing, letting you know which files are being converted, copied over or replaced.

You may cancel the conversion at any time.

Once complete, a report is placed into the dialog and a message window will appear showing you a breakdown count of the bitrates of all the original files that were selected. It will count 512, 256, 128, 96, 64, 48, 32 and 16.
